Areas to Improve:

There is a good range of learning trips or visits during academy hours

We are constantly reviewing the opportunities for visits during the school day. We have to balance this with fitting in all the requirements of the curriculum and the costs to parents and the school budget for these activities. ## Through parents evenings

We have trialled a new format for our parents consultation meetings this term. We have always had 10 minute meetings with parents and their child. This term we allocated 45 minutes per child. 15 minutes for family to look through work and discuss with their child and thirty minutes for the teacher, parents and child to talk in depth about learning. Verbal feedback form parents and staff has been positive.

The Chair of Governors has recently carried out an audit of our school website and we are fully compliant in terms of statutory information required to be published.
