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Areas to Improve:

Through parents evenings

We have trialled a new format for our parents consultation meetings this term. We have always had 10 minute meetings with parents. This term we allocated 45 minutes per child. 15 minutes for family to look through work and discuss with their child and thirty minutes for the teacher, parents and child to talk in depth about learning. Verbal feedback form parents and staff has been positive.
