Mock RRSA was very positive. We will speak to children re-cap with classes on all activities / initiatives carried out. We will make a photo book to talk about the exciting events to remind the children about all they have achieved.

Children to monitor RRSA throughout the school and feedback.

Assembly timetable links to world global days. Children talked about last week's assembly about malaria.

Explained global calendar. Pupil questionnaires have been carried out at Werrington. These will also be carried out at NP. Priorities will be identified. Will also be questionnaires distributed to staff and parents

Countries week on 12<sup>th</sup> June. Children suggested Spain, North Africa, Morocco, Mexico, India, Romania and Russia. Would like to learn about their culture. NT suggested learning about countries they see negatively e.g. Syria, Russia. Invite people with information e.g. international correspondent George Alagiah (via SC)
